
**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF CASTLE PINES, COLORADO
OPPOSING AMENDMENT 64
IN THE NOVEMBER 6, 2012 ELECTION**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CASTLE PINES, COLORADO, THAT:


1. At the November 2, 2010 election, the voters of Castle Pines approved the prohibition of medical marijuana businesses within the corporate limits of the City.
2. At the November 6, 2012 election, the voters of Castle Pines will be asked to consider Amendment 64, The Regulate Marijuana Like Alcohol Act of 2012 (“Amendment 64”).
3. Amendment 64 would make Colorado the first state in the United States to legalize marijuana for recreational purposes.
4. Amendment 64 would allow anyone twenty-one years or older to possess and consume up to one ounce of marijuana.
5. Amendment 64 would permit opening marijuana retail stores, growing facilities, manufacturing facilities and testing facilities in the Castle Pines community.
6. Amendment 64 conflicts with federal law.
7. Amendment 64 would likely result in increased use of marijuana, harming our children and the educational environment in Colorado.
8. Passage of Amendment 64 would harm Colorado’s image as a healthy place to live, work and raise a family.
9. Amendment 64 is opposed by the Colorado Municipal League, the Douglas County Sheriff, and numerous other elected officials, cities and counties in the State of Colorado.
10. The City Council supports a “no” vote on Amendment 64.

THIS RESOLUTION SHALL TAKE EFFECT UPON ITS APPROVAL BY CITY COUNCIL.


