The objective of this community survey was to measure and understand Castle Pines residents' thoughts and opinions of town services, programs, priorities, and quality of life aspects.

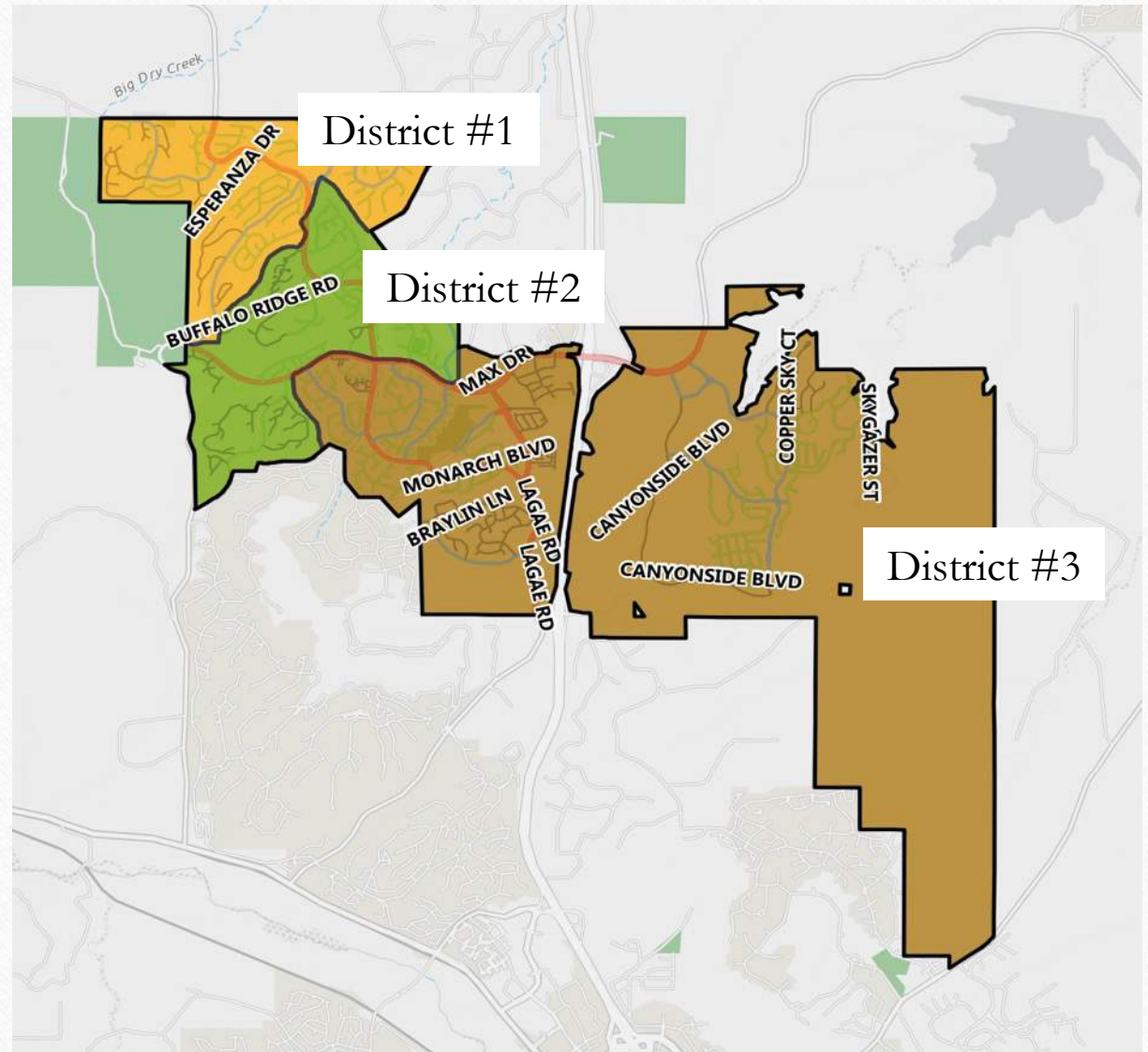

Survey Methodology

- Magellan Strategies is pleased to present the results of an online survey of 907 residents in the City of Castle Pines, CO. The survey data was collected using MMS text invitations, the City email database, and social media promotion methods.
- The interviews were conducted from September 21st - October 4th, 2022.
- The overall survey responses have a margin of error of +/- 3.09% at the 95% confidence interval. Population subgroups will have a higher margin of error than the overall sample.
- The survey results were weighted to be representative of the adult population demographics for the City of Castle Pines.

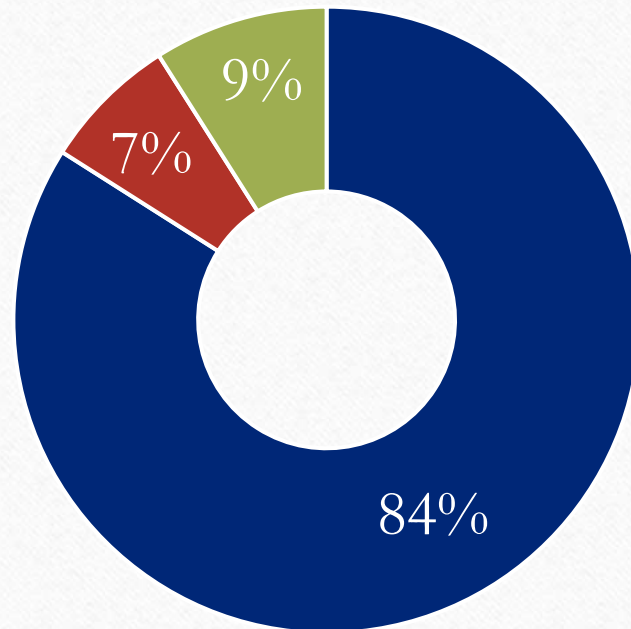

Compared to other cities and towns in Colorado, how would you rate the City of Castle Pines as a place to live?

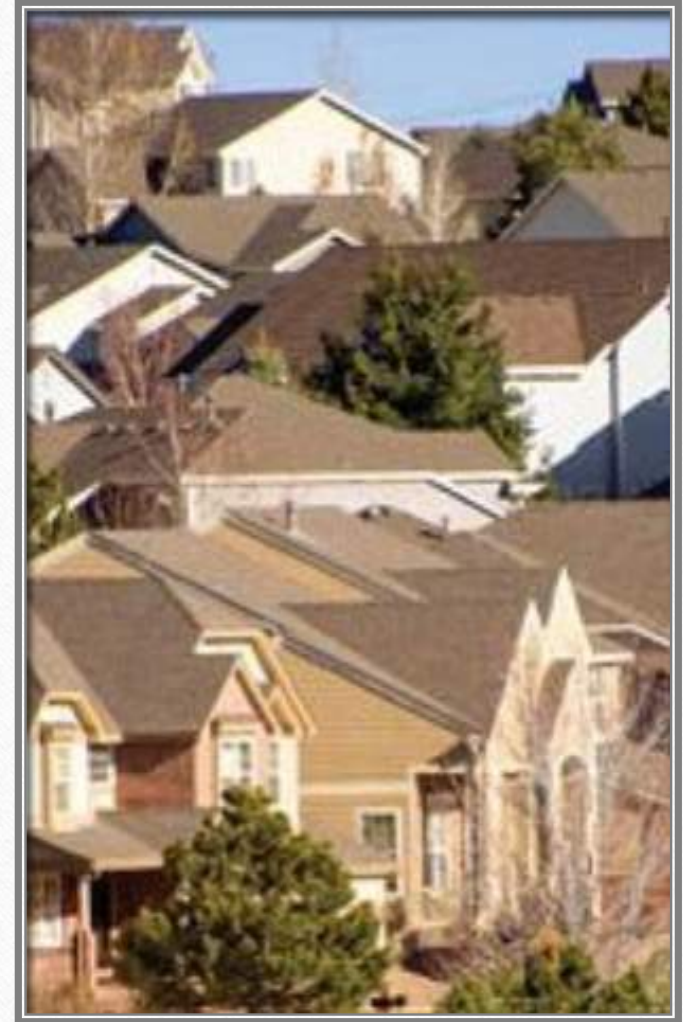

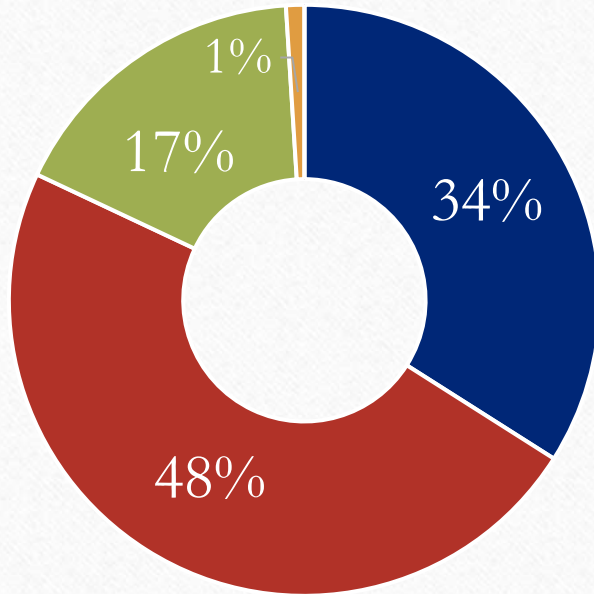

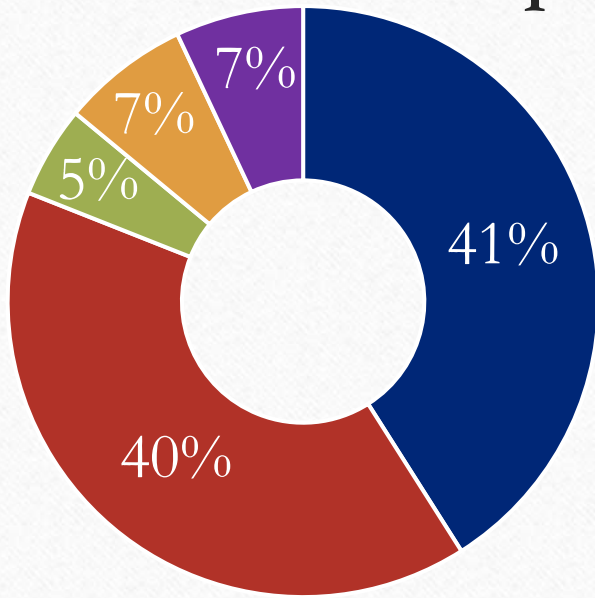

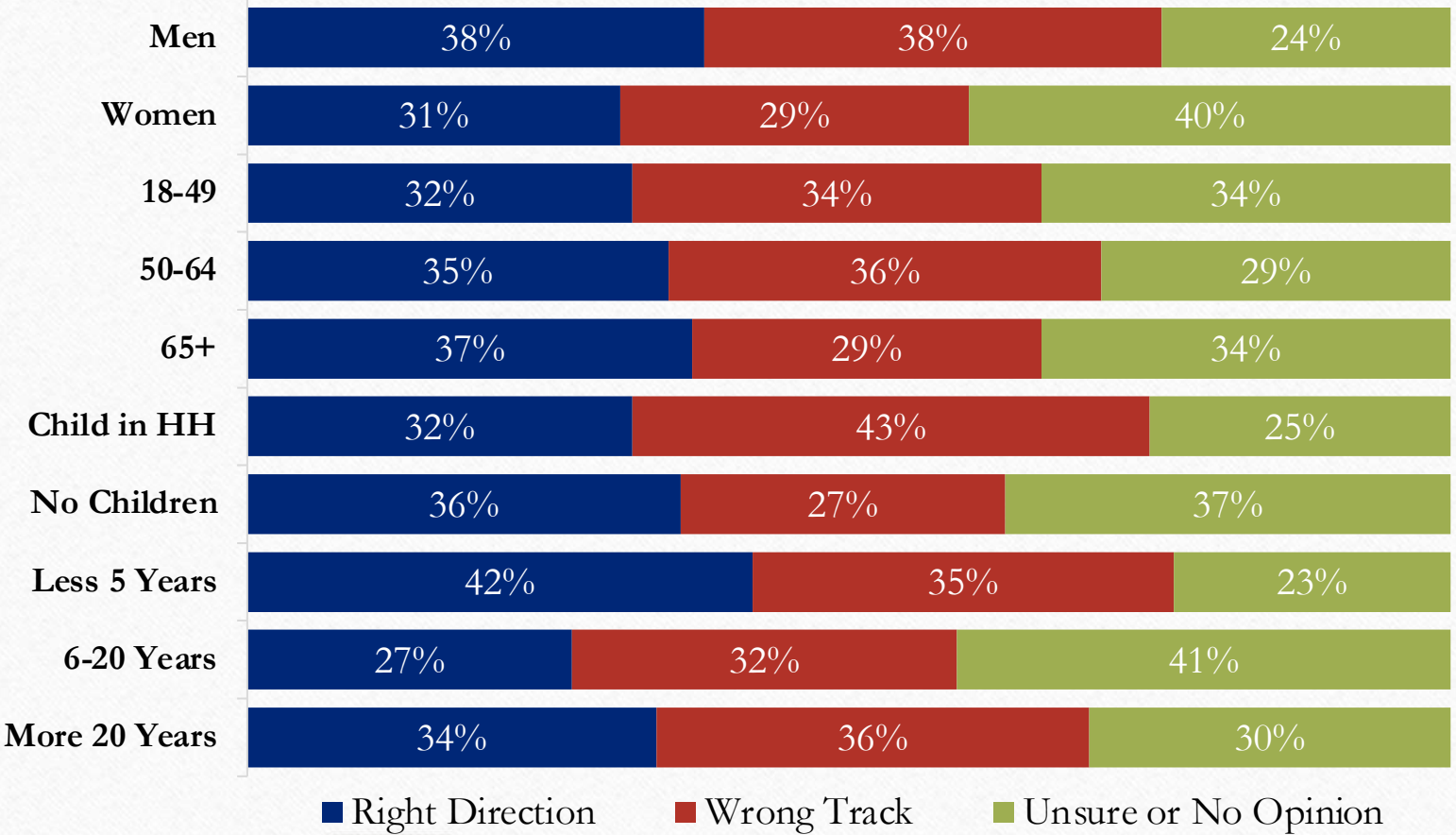

- “Getting more friendly families, great schools and parks, and infrastructure seems to be improving.” -Male, 40-44, Lagae Ranch
- “We are starting to have more community activities to build a sense of belonging. We are trying to improve roads and improve parks.” -Female, 35-39, Noble Ridge East
- “Castle Pines is headed in the right direction because I see the investment and dedication to growth and opportunity in housing, business, roads, landscaping/aesthetics, community events, and communication between residents and the city. Keeping up with growth is good but getting ahead of it and being proactive in smart growth is an area of improvement.” -Female, 35-39, Tapadero
- “The current administration listens to the citizens, takes action that citizens want, and communicates well with citizens.” -Male, 60-64, Forest Park.
- “Improving roads, more businesses, excellent trails, parks, and recreational areas, adding pickleball courts, a clean and attractive city.” -Female, 60-64, Green Briar

- “Too much residential home growth, no long-term solution for water resources, too little shopping and entertainment.” -Male, 40-44, Briarcliff
- “Disappointed that in the 18 years we have been here, we do not have a family indoor recreation center, only one grocery store that receives already diminished supplies last (so you can’t find basic goods available at their other stores), and few quality dining options. Though we live here, we go elsewhere for those services. The roads seem to have been continually in need of repair. We are hoping this final effort will be the last.” -Female, 55-59, Buffalo Ridge
- “We are lacking in shopping and dining resources. The Castle Pines road project is a disaster, with bike lanes taking one full lane for cars – unbelievable! Our grocery store is often out of items and higher gas prices than most other King Soopers. Are there plans to encourage other grocery stores, such as Trader Joe’s to be in Castle Pines? Parker seems to have it together- maybe meet with their city council for ideas!” -Female, 75+, Castle Pointe
- “Too much growth in homes to accommodate the water sources we have. The street repair and planning is not well thought out, and the quality is not very good. Mixing concrete with asphalt?” -Male, 65-69, Esperanza

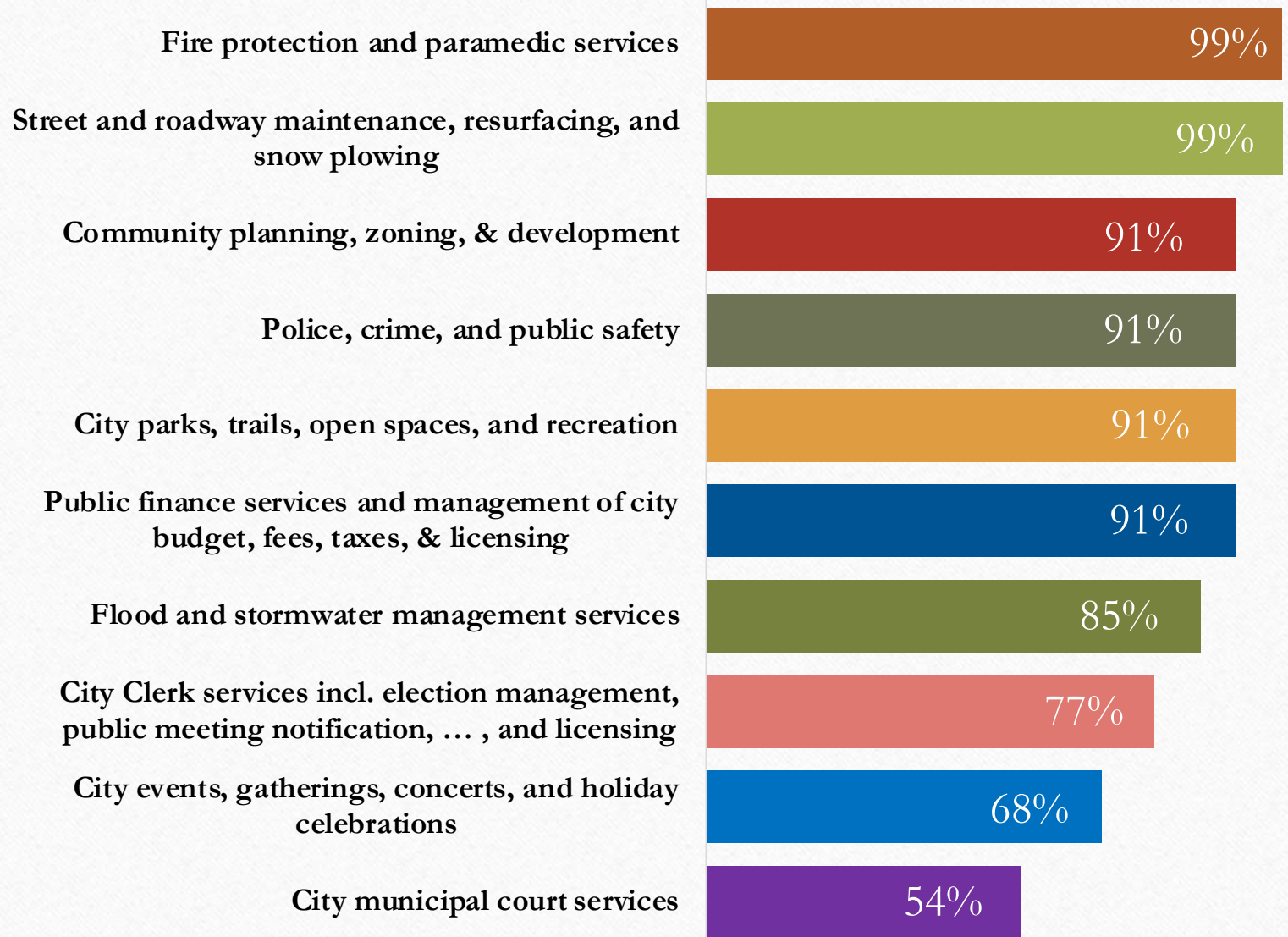

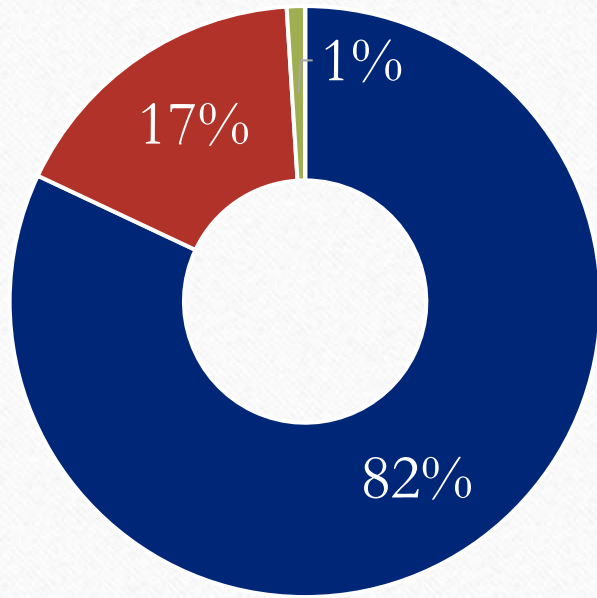

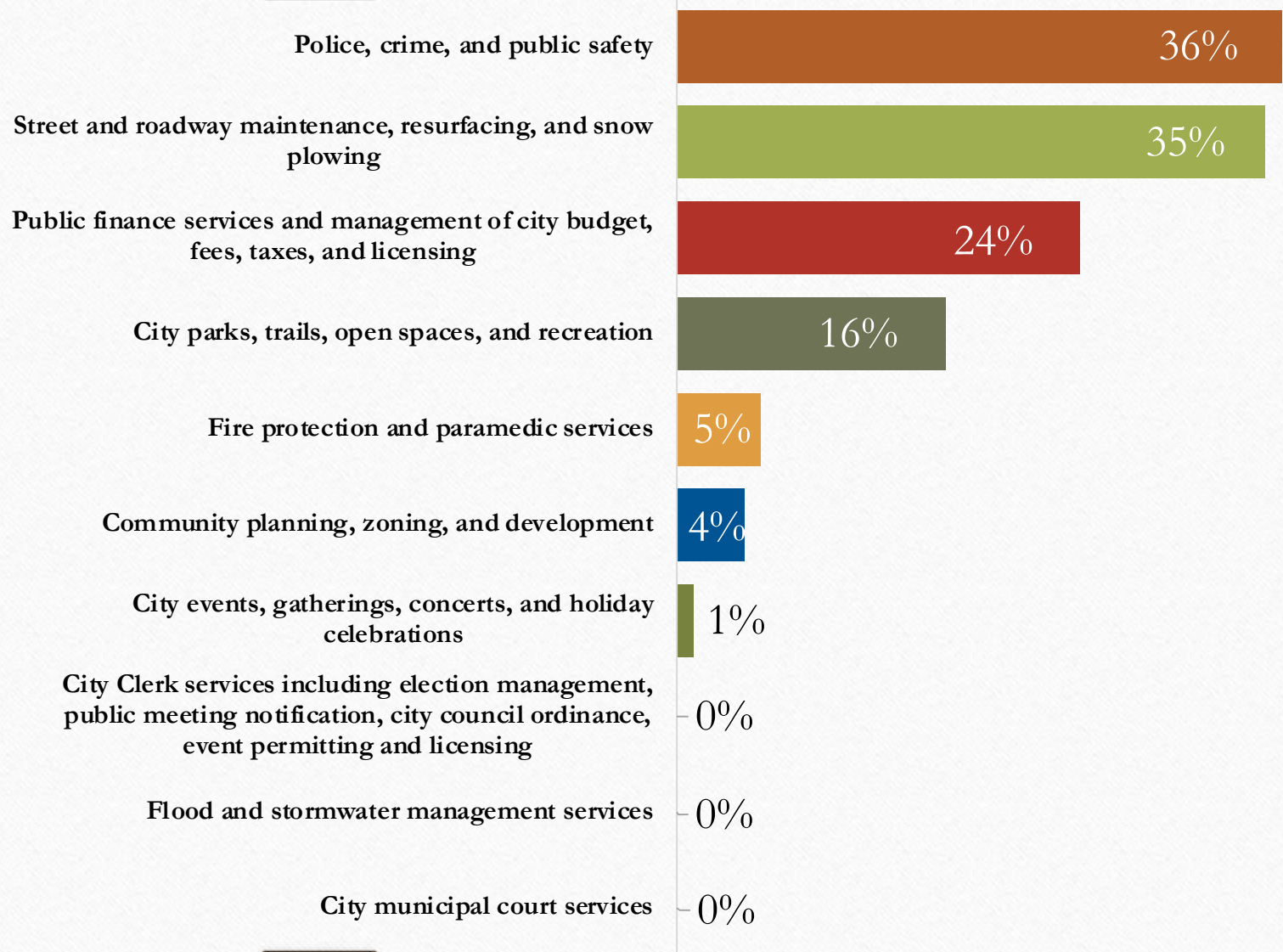

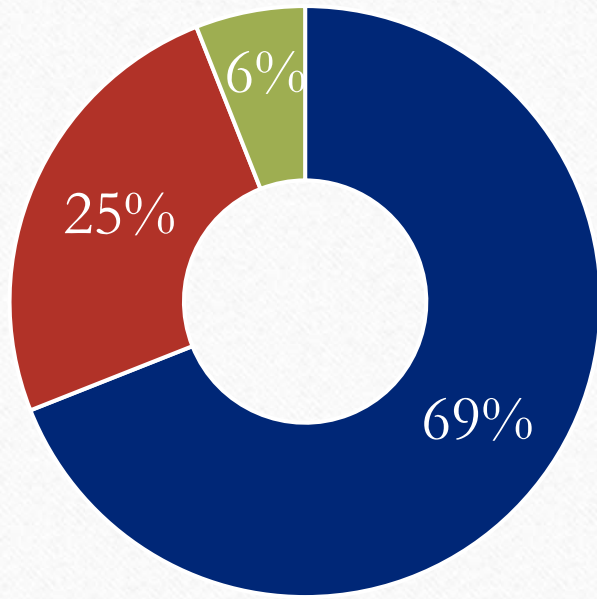

Utilize all methods of communication possible to inform residents of city matters

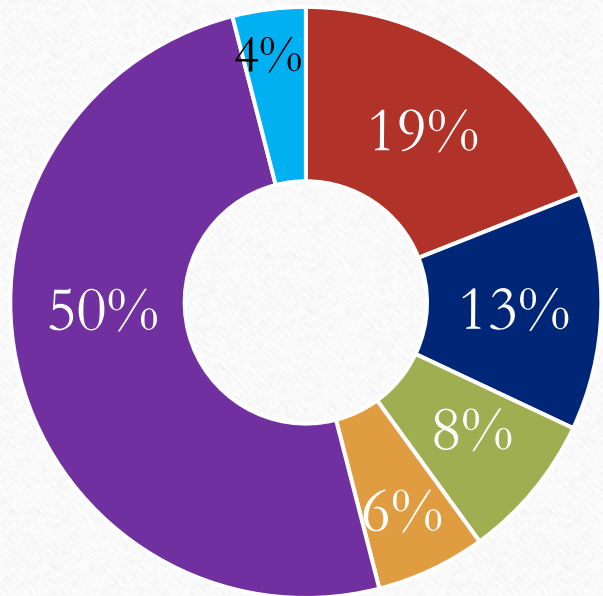
- “In general, communication is sparse and inconsistent. Castle Pines is growing like crazy, and you'd think we would hear more about what is happening and what is planned for the future.” -Female, 60-64, Castle Pointe
- “Residents should be notified about certain projects happening on their streets before they happen. For instance, the residents in Forest Park were "blindsided" by the removal of the lane and addition of the bike lane right outside Forest Park. Had residents known in advance, there might have been less of a "backlash" of public comments.” -Female, 40-44, Forest Park
- “Continue to utilize social media, email, and City website to freely share updates with community. Allow community to submit suggestions, and solutions if needed or wanted. Not everyone is nice, so....” -Female, 50-54, Kings Crossing
- “I would like to see a process put in place to allow council to respond to remarks made at council meetings. As it presently “works” residents are allowed to make a 3-minute statement with no provision for council feedback. It feels like we are talking to the proverbial fence post. The takeaway for residents is “why bother?”” – Female, 65-69, Knights Bridge

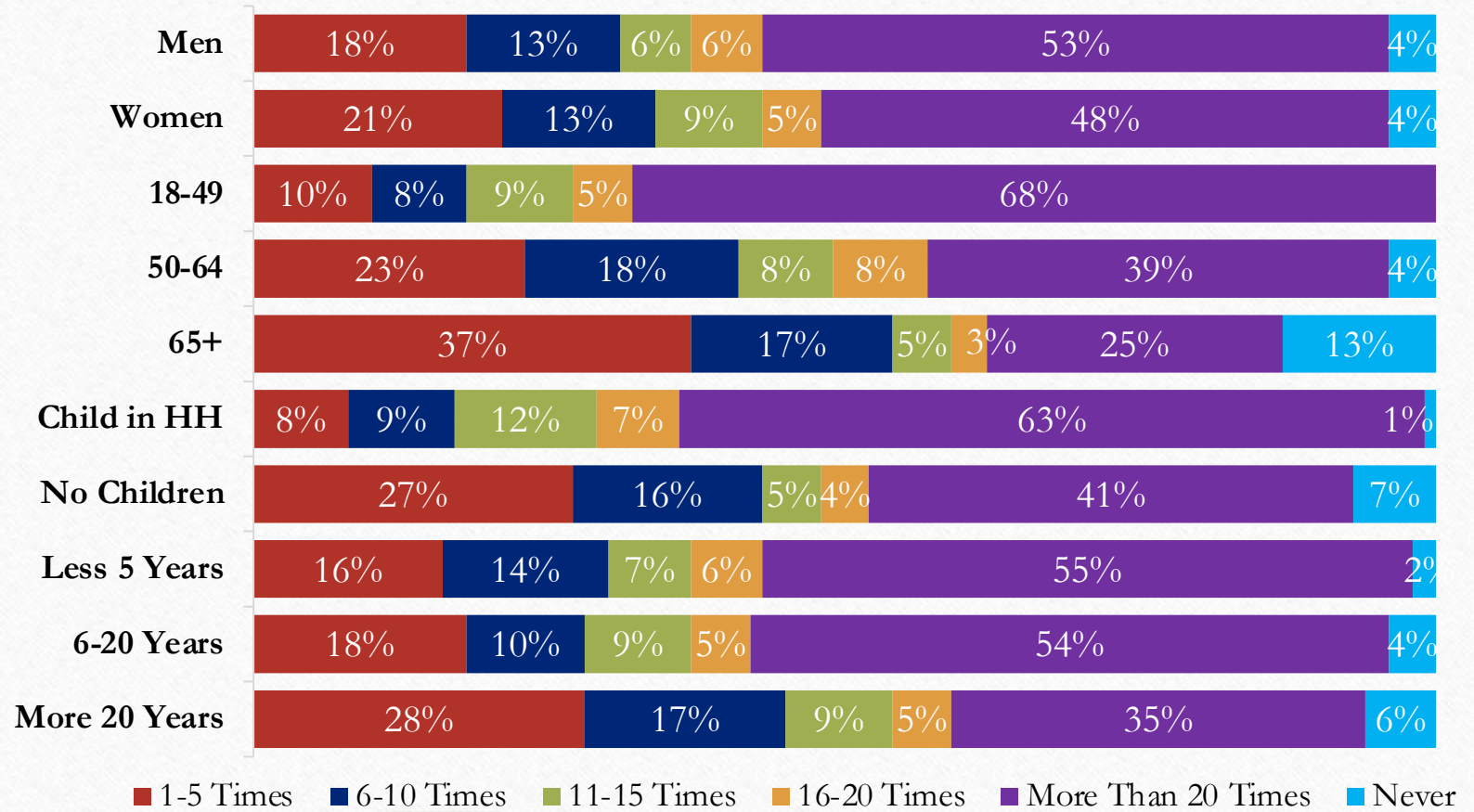

In the past 12 months, how many times have you or someone in your household visited a park or outdoor recreation area in Castle Pines?

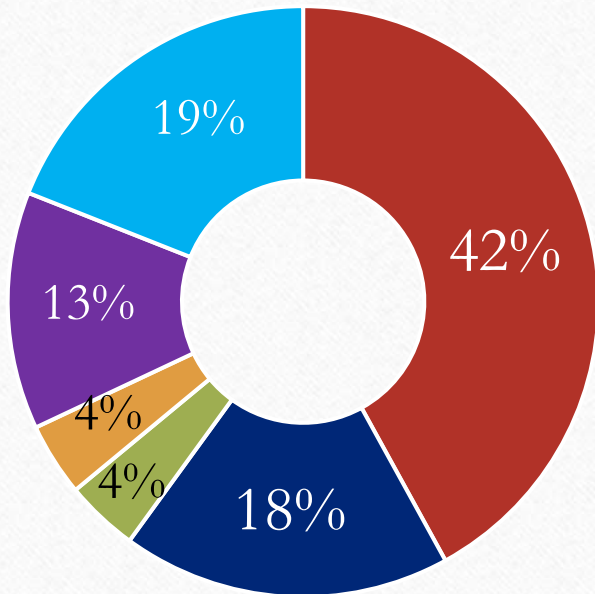

- “A community pool and rec center. I've never seen a city where they let each HOA handle it like it to its own. Why do some communities have things that others don't? The city should be providing this, an opportunity for everybody to enjoy recreation. I am currently in Hidden Pointe, and there are no services there. – **Male, 45-49, Hidden Pointe**
- “Botanical or community garden. Designated open space. Paths connecting new neighborhoods & open space. More bluebird boxes in open spaces. - **Female, 50-54, Knights Bridge**
- “Maintain or expand walking and biking paths. Would like a safer way to bike to the shopping center like King Soopers.” –**Female, 50-54, Retreat**

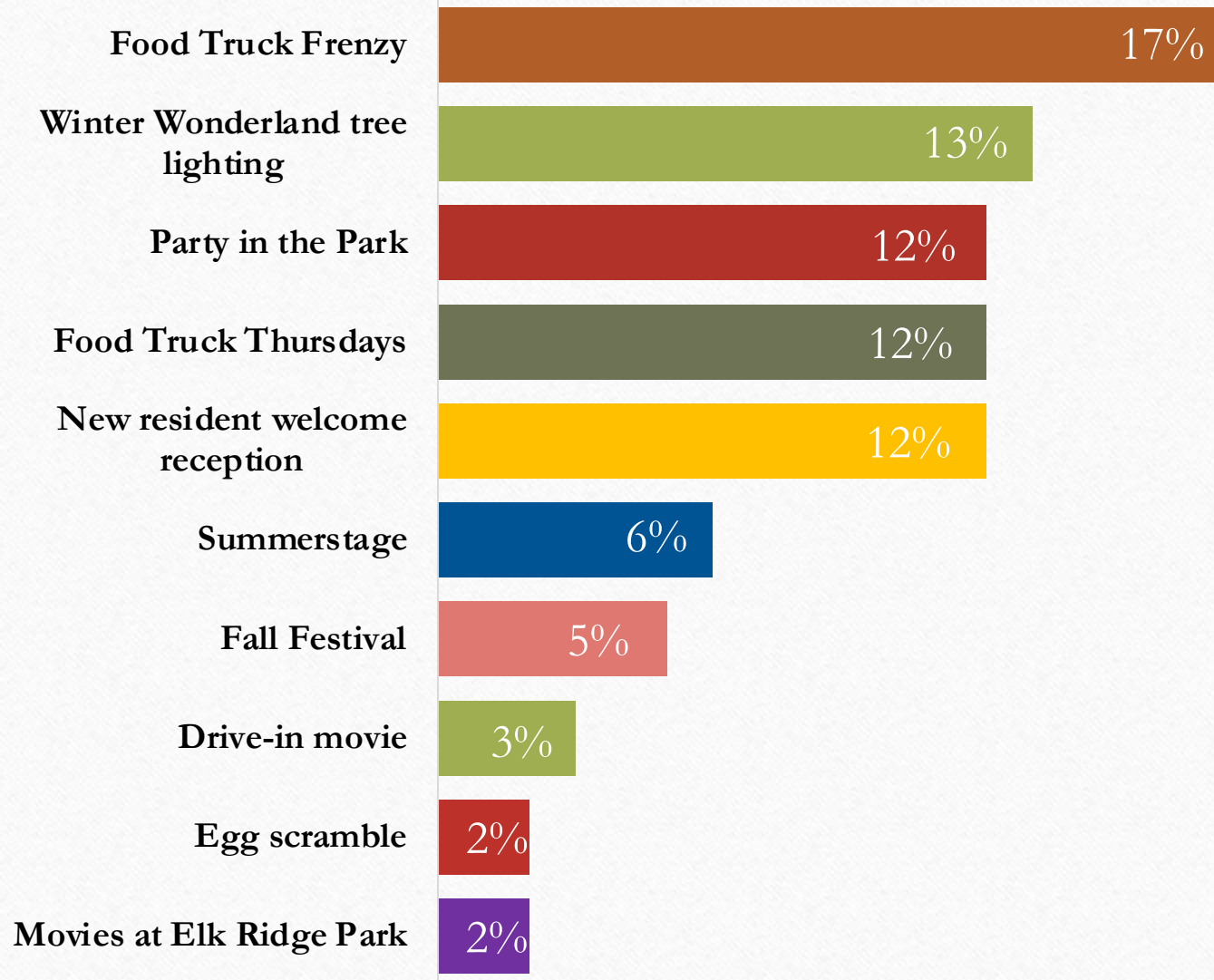

- “Concerts have done well in other communities I have lived.” –Male, 45-49, Serena

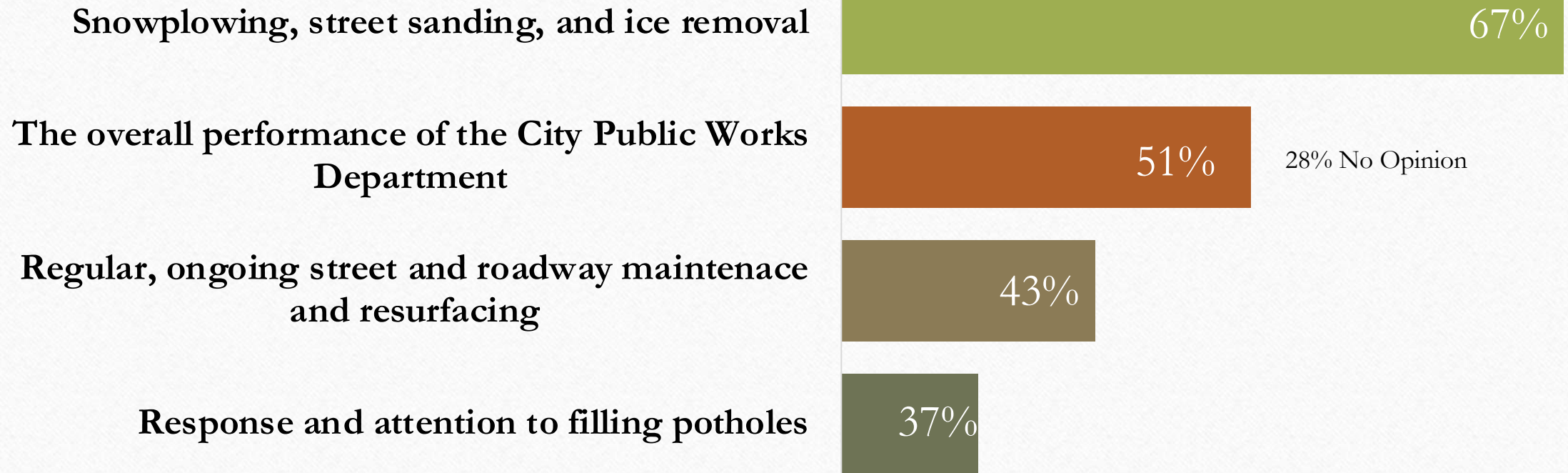

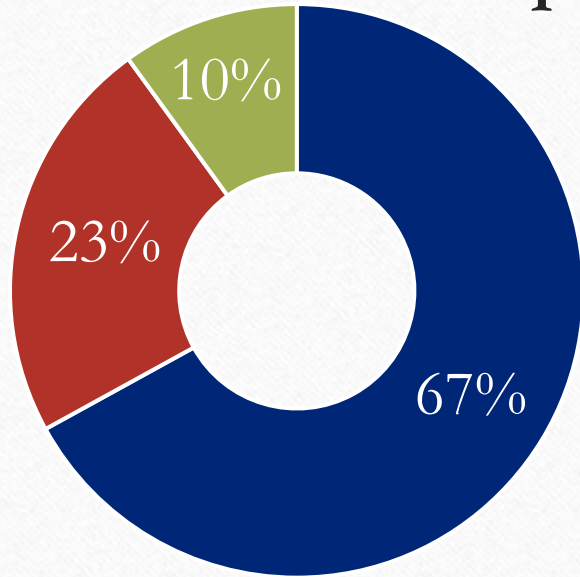

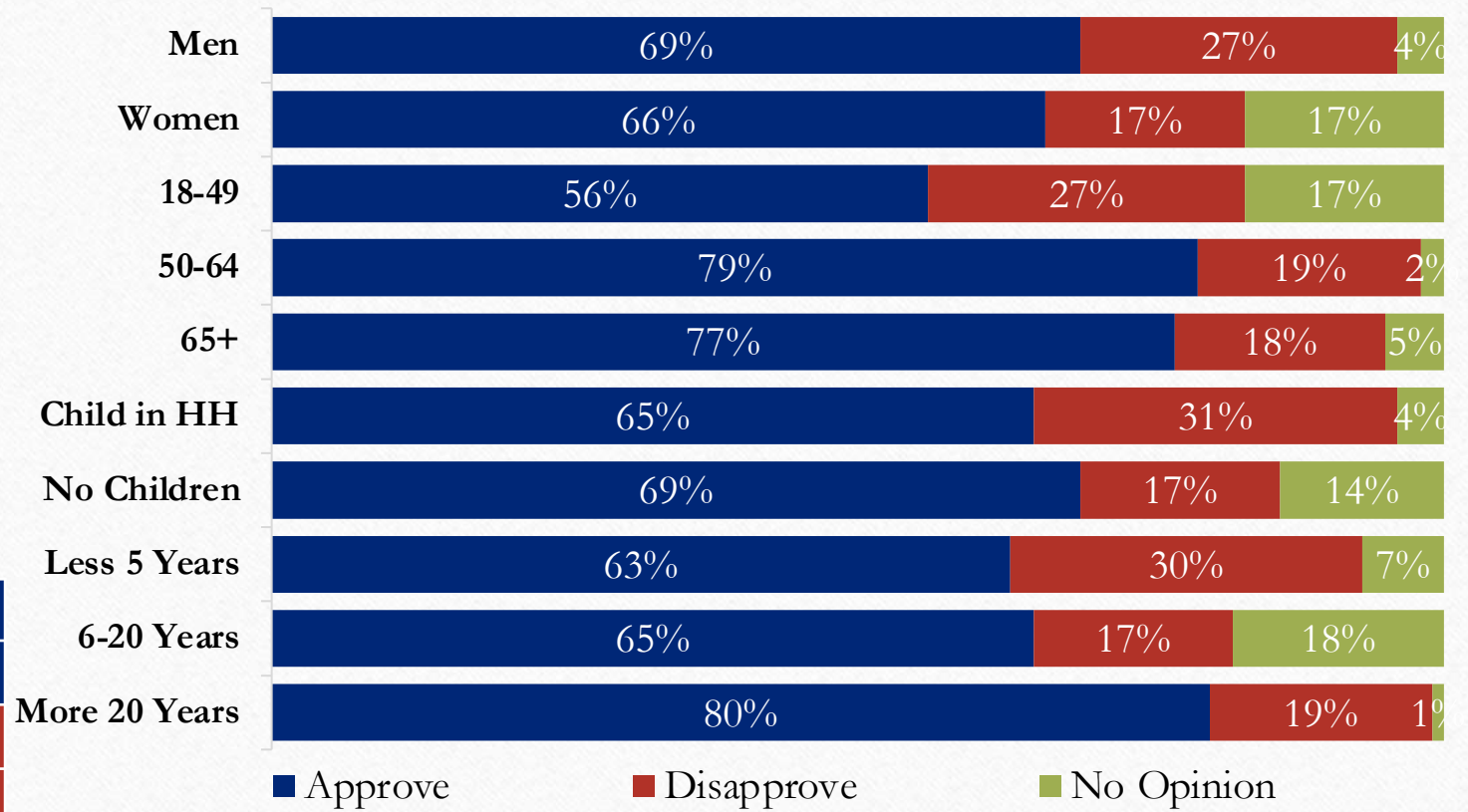

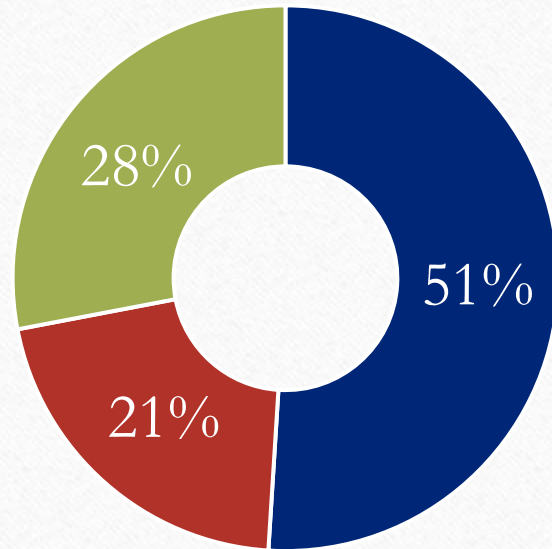

Snowplowing, street sanding, and ice removal



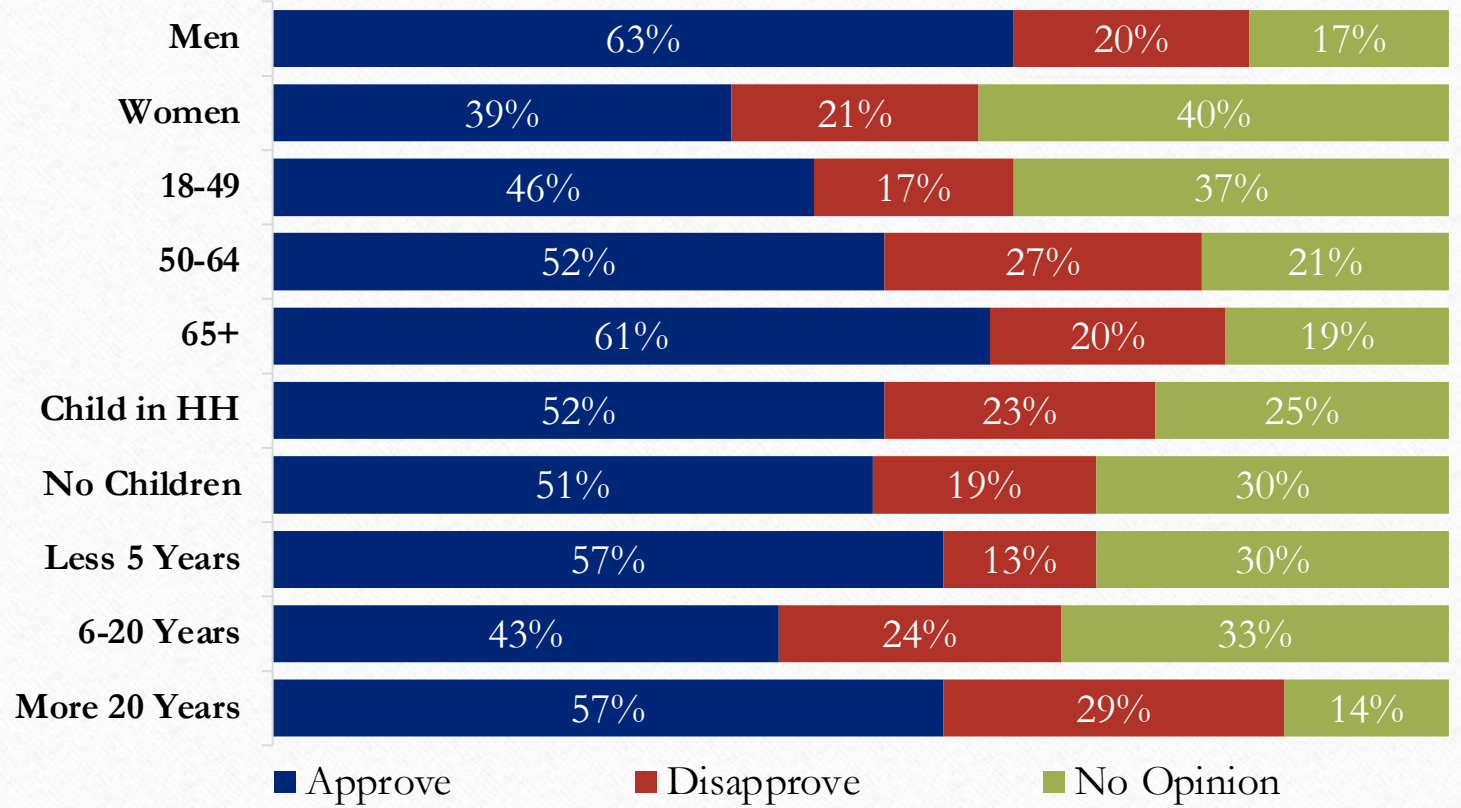

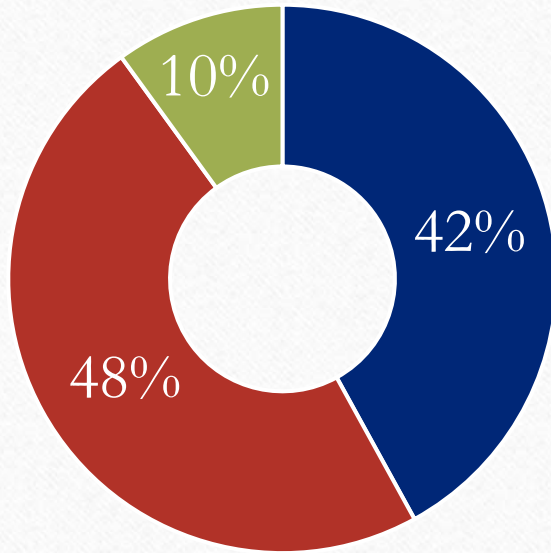

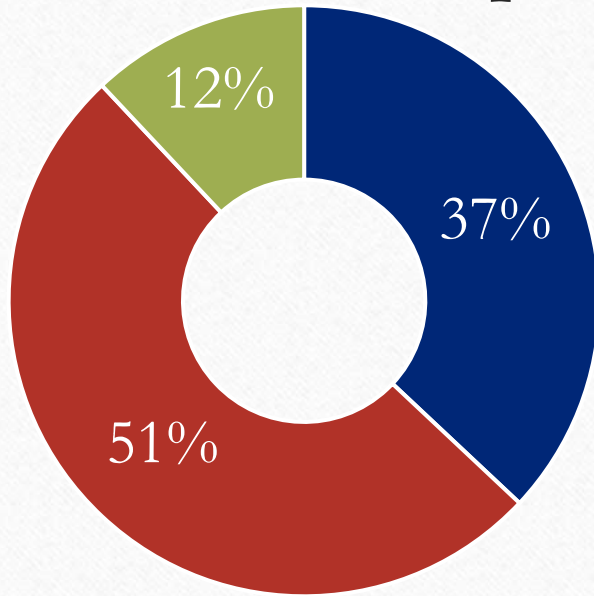

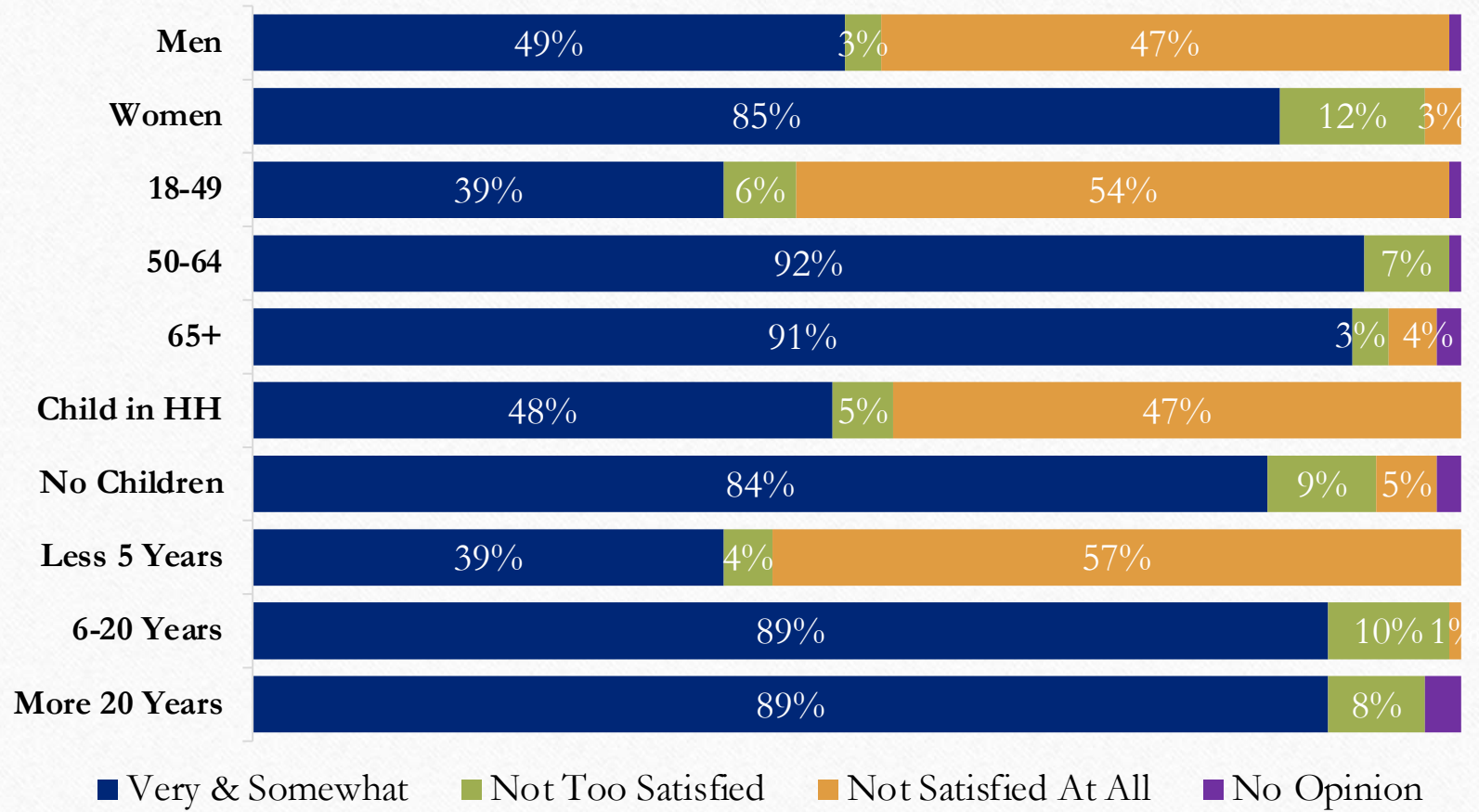

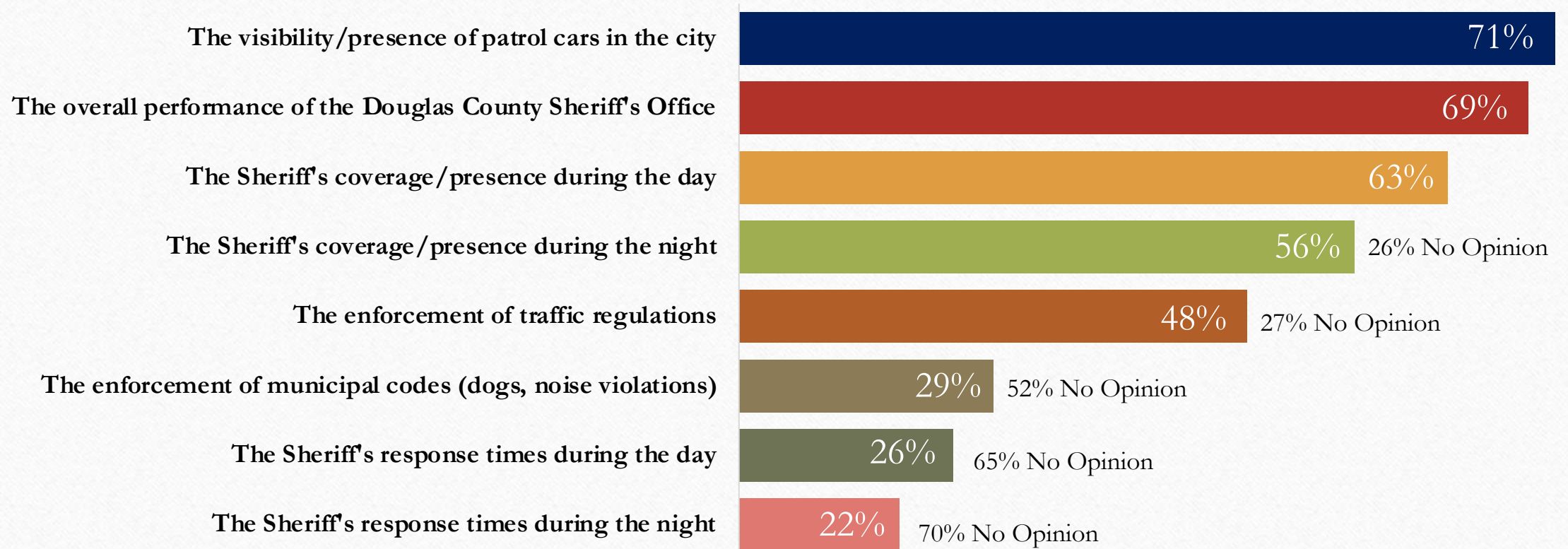

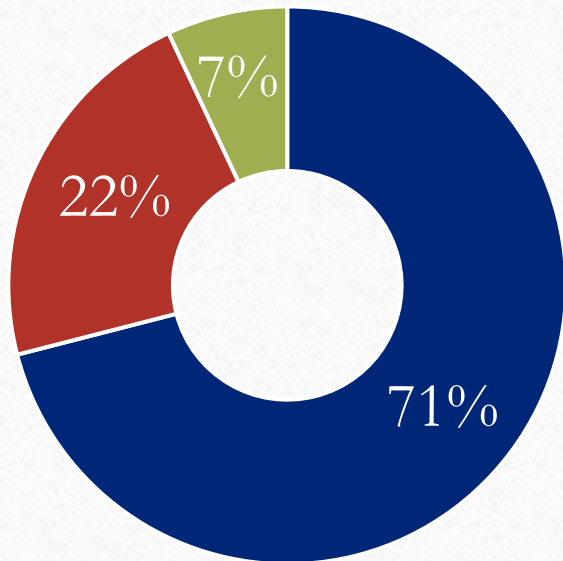


Please indicate if you approve or disapprove of the following law enforcement services provided by the Douglas County Sherriff's Office.

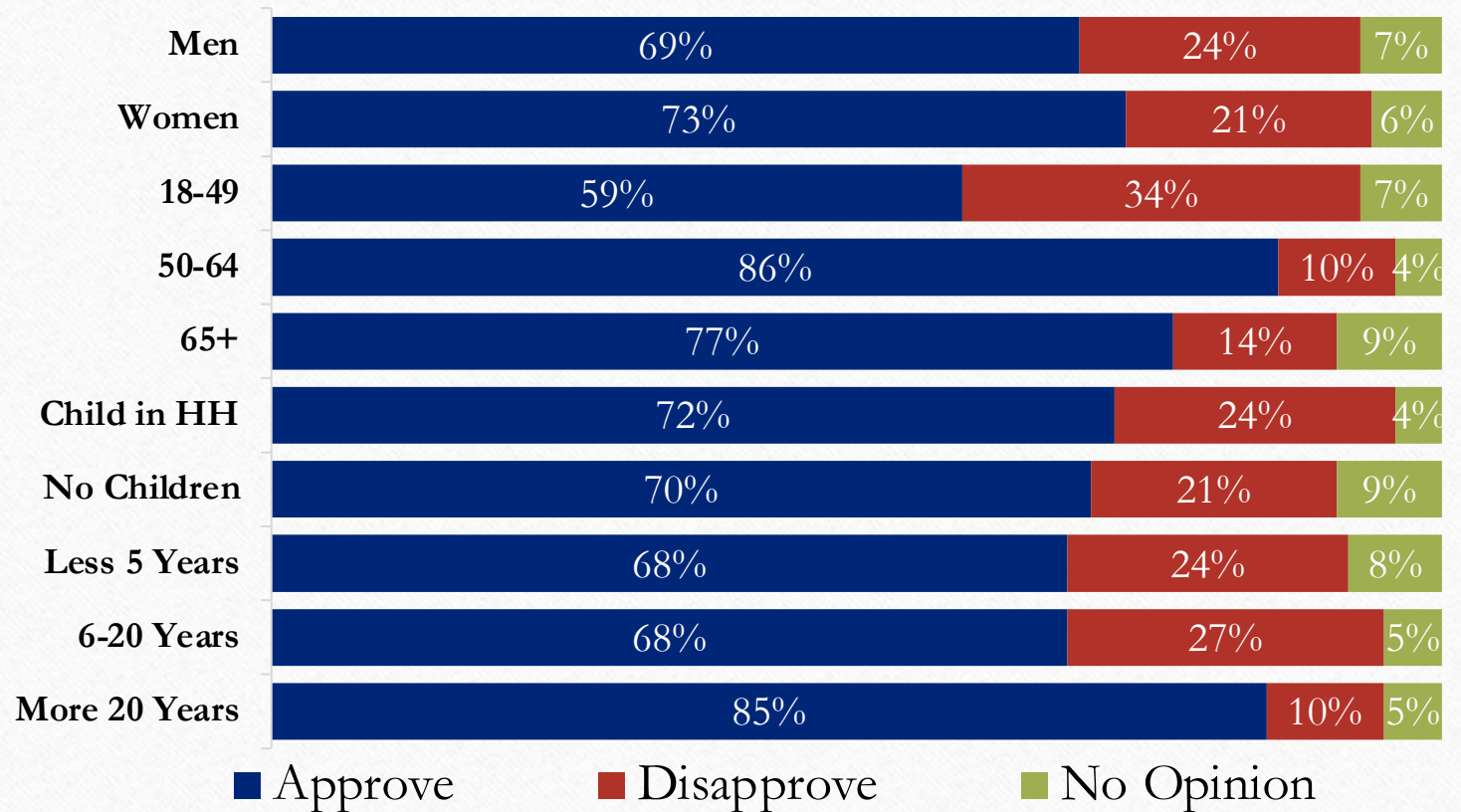

The visibility/presence of patrol cars in the city

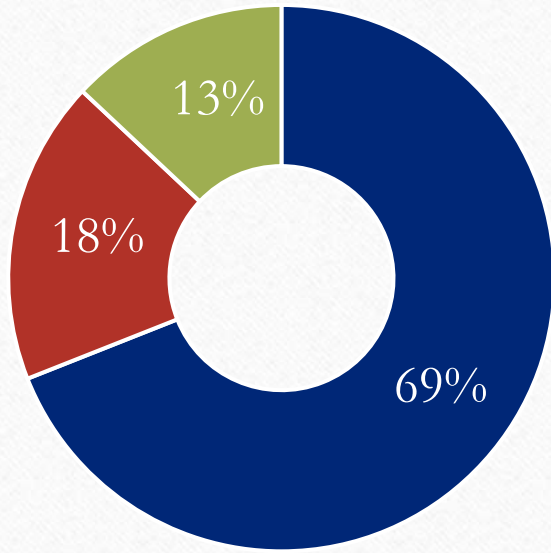

The enforcement of traffic regulations



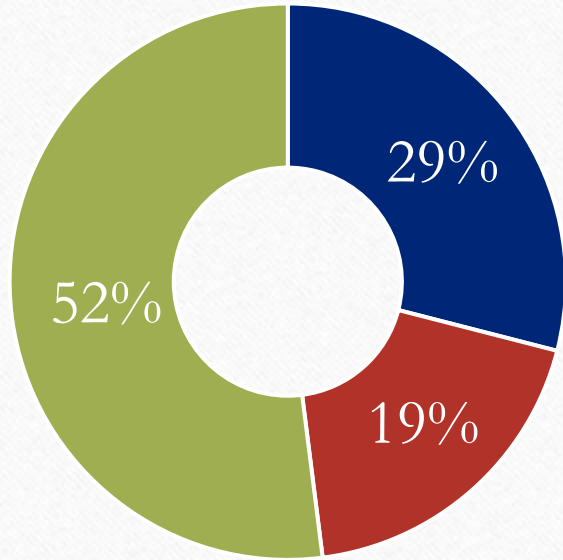

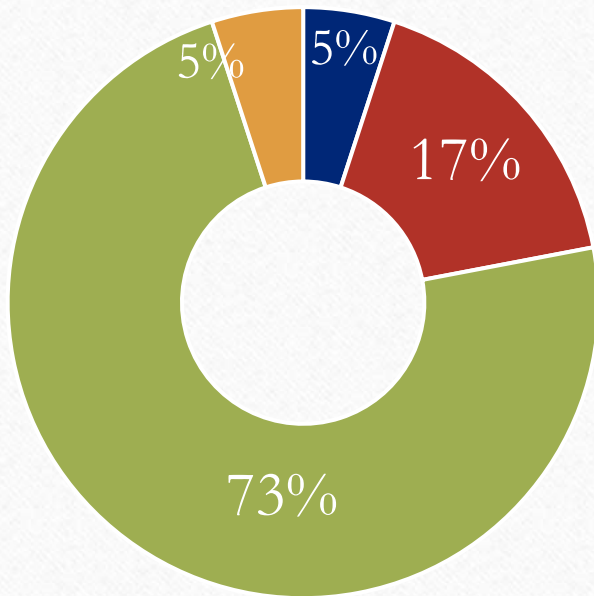
How would you rate the speed of new residential housing growth and development in Castle Pines for the past five years?



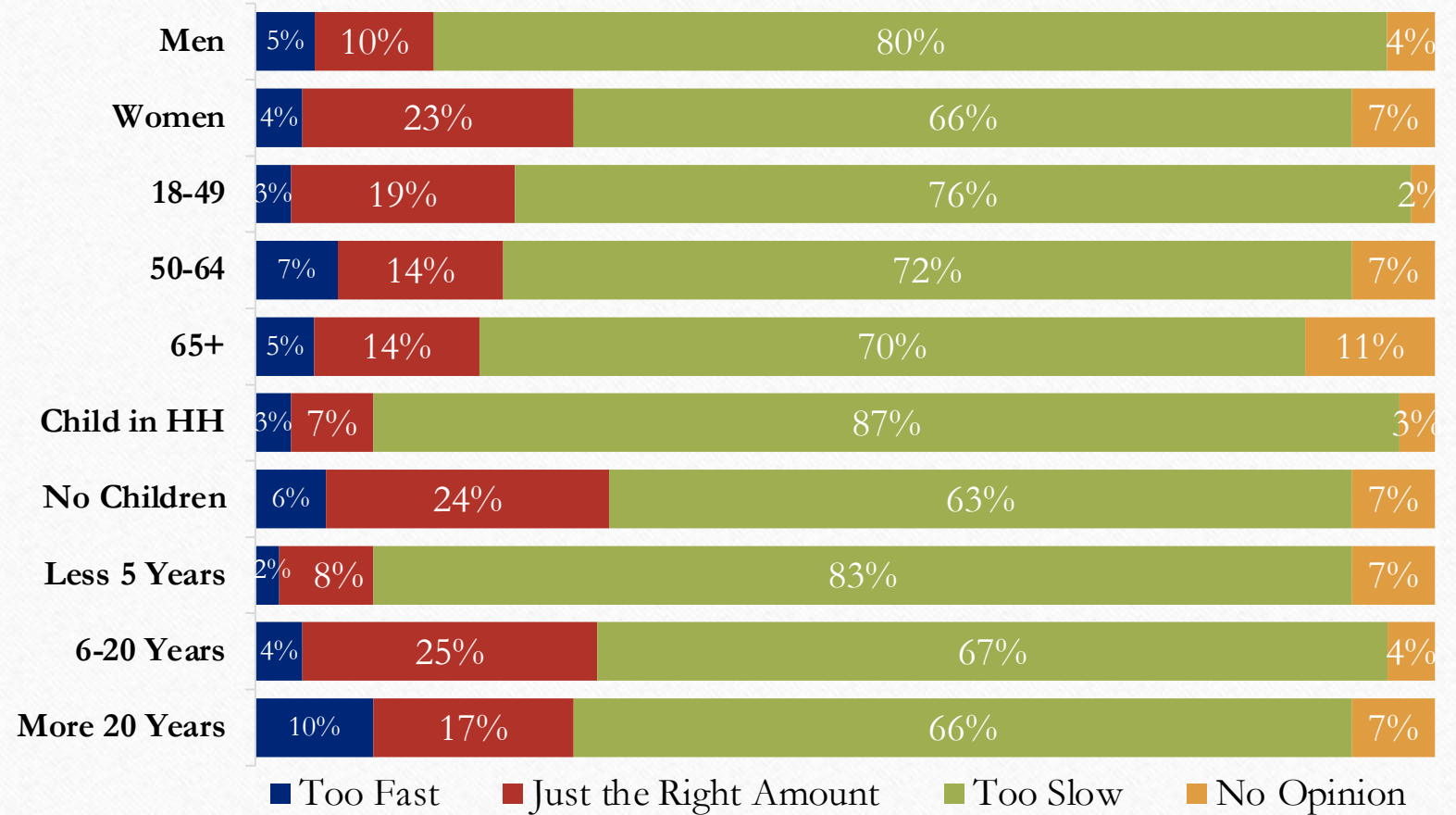

How would you rate the speed of new retail commercial growth and development in Castle Pines for the past five years?

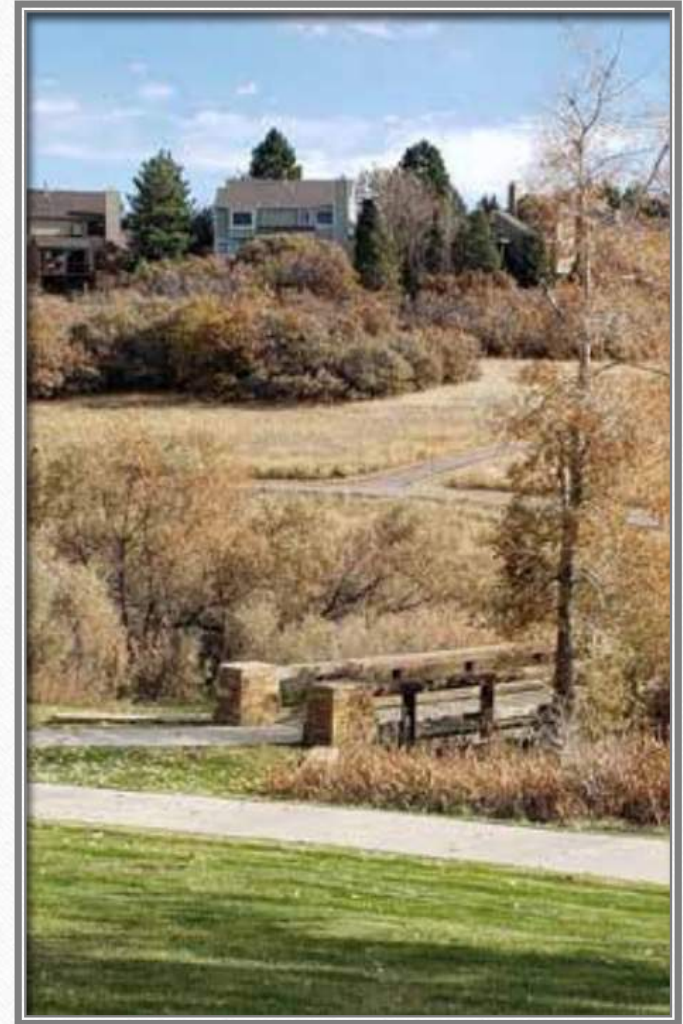

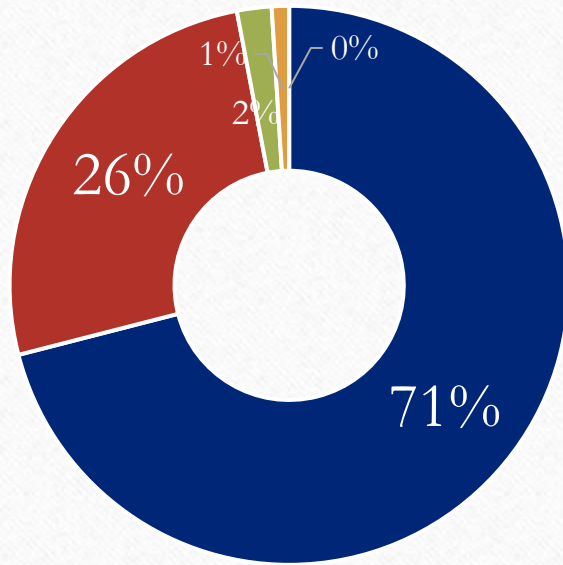

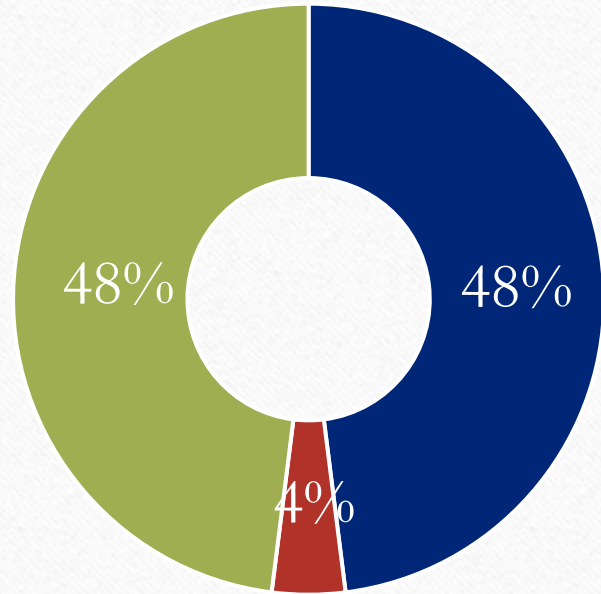

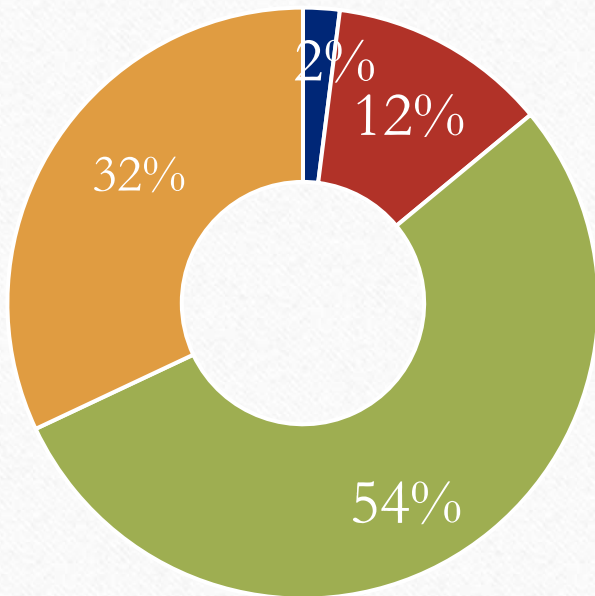

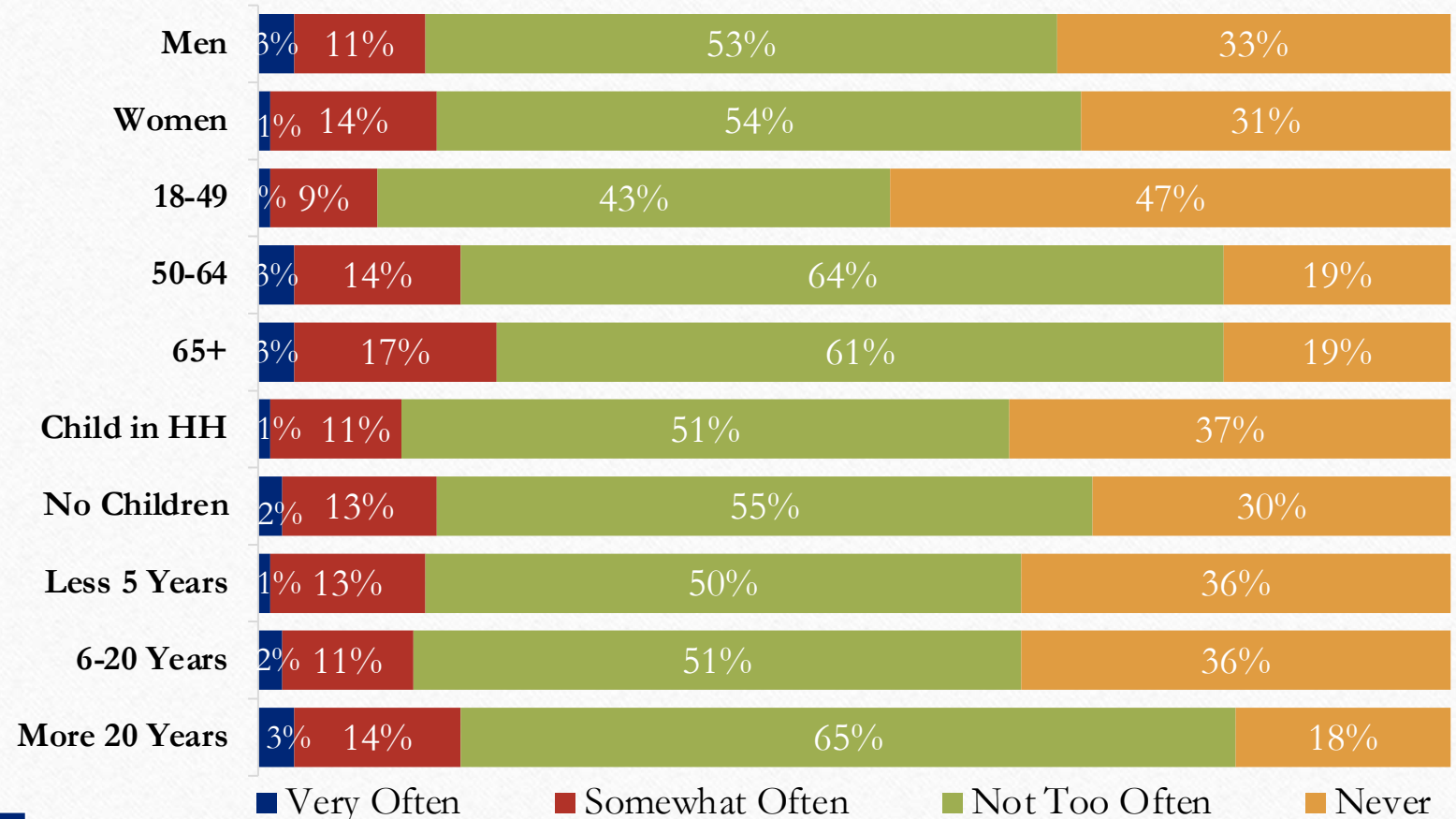

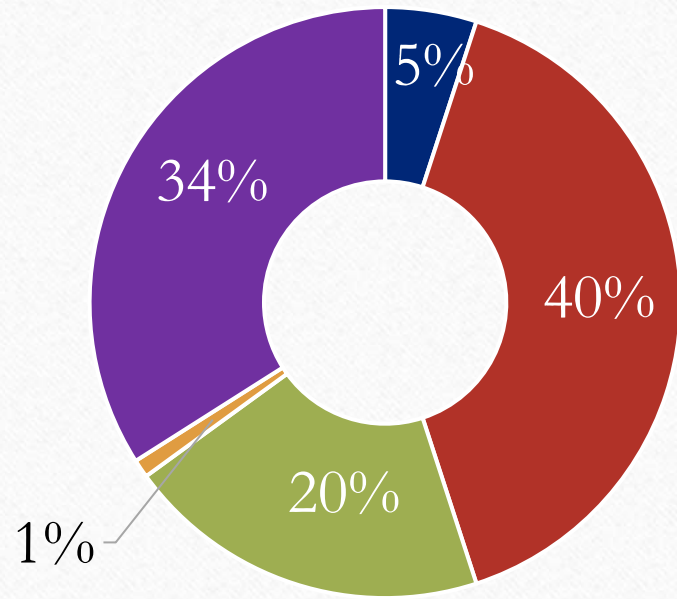

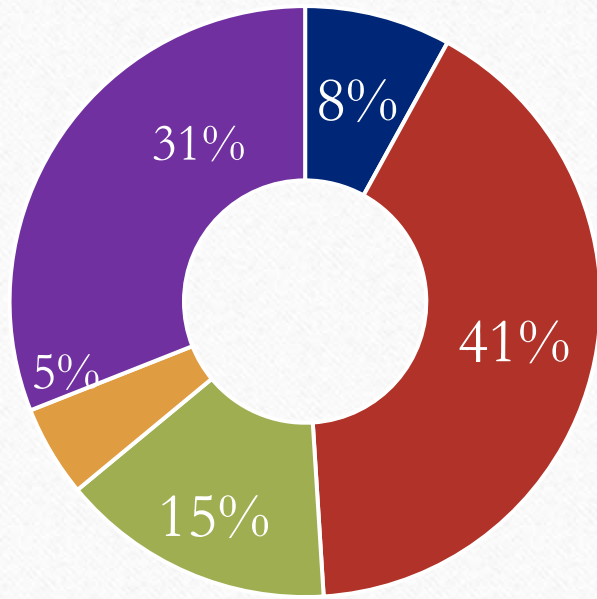

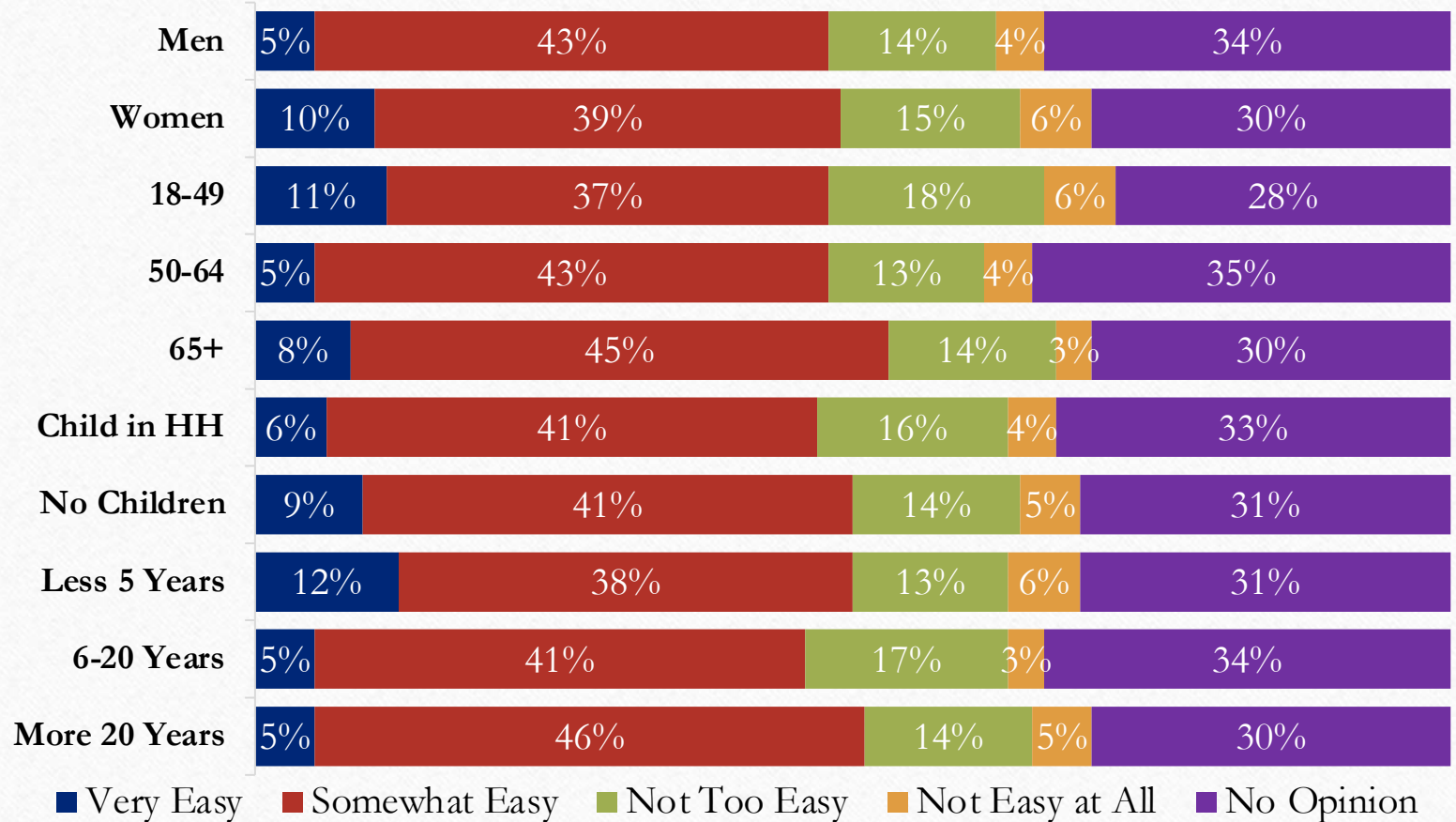

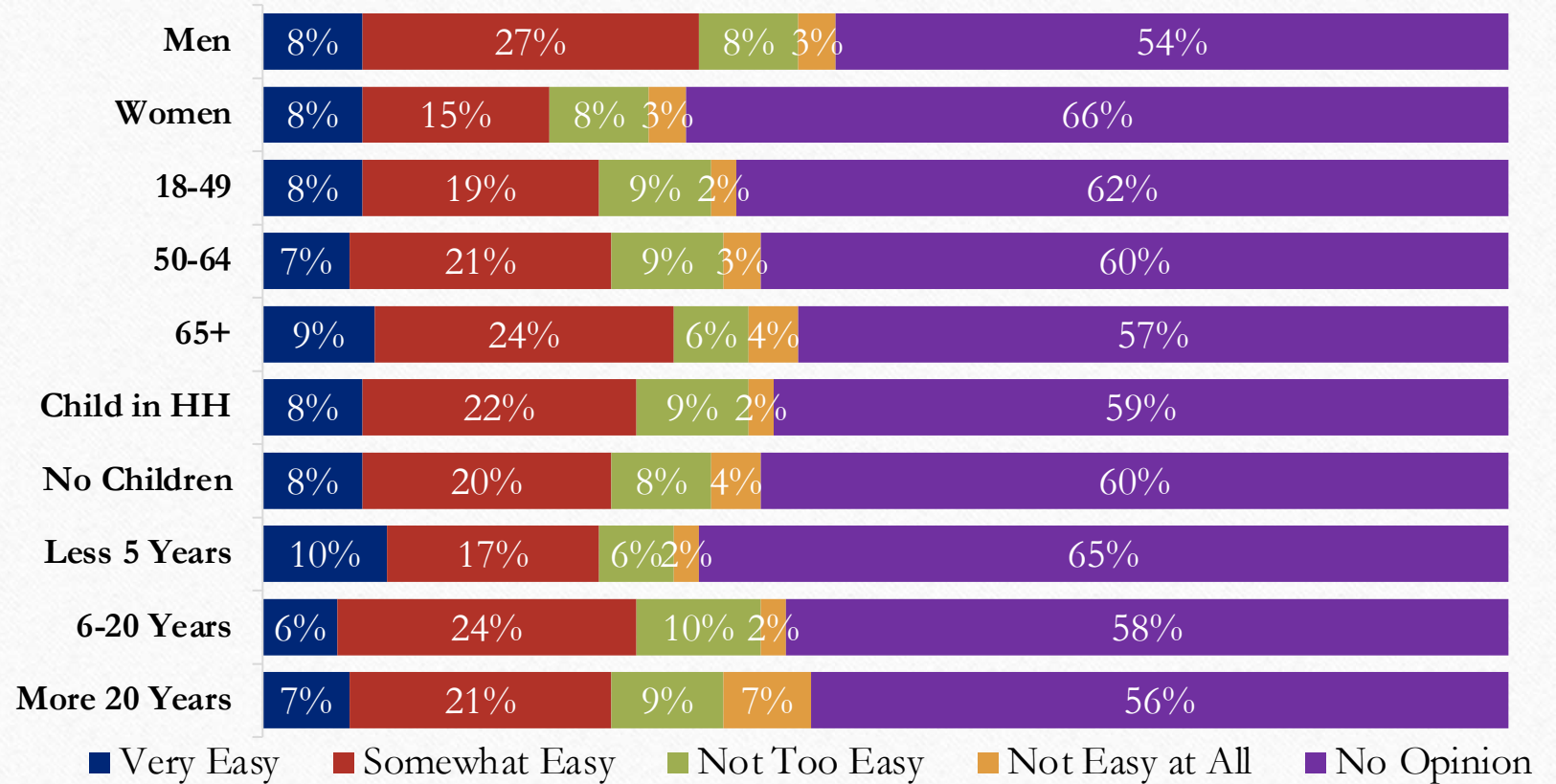
